Community organizations and anchor institutions that provide digital inclusion services must comprehensively understand community needs to provide services catered to the needs of program participants. Together, panelists will share their digital equity program efforts, core lessons, and key takeaways to inform others working with covered populations. The Digital Equity Act defines covered populations as individuals whose incomes are below 150% of the poverty level, aging individuals (60+), incarcerated individuals not in a Federal correctional facility, veterans, individuals with disabilities, individuals with a language barrier, Individuals who are members of a racial or ethnic minority group, and individuals who primarily reside in a rural area.
